


How to Make a Pizza Art Storage Box

Hey kids! You'll need a great place to keep all of your art projects or supplies and this favorite lesson will give you a work box for that – AND you're recycling! It's a pizza box! Pizza boxes are strong AND big enough to handle lots of art projects or supplies!

HERE'S WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Crayons, markers or colored pencils
- 🖊 Non-toxic glue
- 4 Scissors
- **4** Construction paper
- Clean extra-large pizza box



INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Using the scissors, and only with an adult's supervision, cut a construction paper label for the top of a clean, extra-large pizza box. Create a label with crayons, markers or colored pencils. Write the year, your name and other information. Attach the label to the box with non-toxic glue.

STEP 2

Decorate your work box with bright borders, stripes, dots or any designs you like on the top and sides! Line, color, shape and pattern are part of the basic art elements that will create a great design. Make your box look as exciting as the projects you'll put inside!



SAFETY GUIDELINES

 Safety guidelines recommend this art project as suitable for children ages 4 years and older. Close adult supervision is required to ensure children's safety.
ATTENTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling. Adult supervision is recommended with all children.

PARENTS & EDUCATORS

This lesson offers a great way to discuss some of the elements of art. Review the terms below with your kids and students.

Line – a path of a moving point

Color – reflected light with three properties: hue (the name of a color), intensity (the brightness or dullness of a color) and value (the lightness or darkness of a color) **Shape** – an area that is enclosed by line, color, value, texture, etc.; two-dimensional **Pattern** – a design, model or plan used in making things
